ALAMEDA COUNTY WATER DISTRICT PARTNERS WITH BAYWORK AND REGIONAL AGENCIES FOR CAREER FAIR

Fremont, Calif. — The Alameda County Water District (ACWD), a member agency of BAYWORK, will participate with regional water and wastewater utilities, community colleges, and professional associations to hold the baywork.org S.T.E.M. (Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math) Career Fair on Friday, March 6 from 3 – 7 p.m., at the California State Building convention center with entrances at 350 Golden Gate Avenue and 455 McAllister Street in San Francisco. This event is free and open to the public.

The career fair will allow job-seekers to learn more about water and wastewater careers and opportunities, training and education, and veteran’s career resources. In addition to informational booths, the career fair will offer three panel presentations:

- **Be Invaluable: Baywork Careers:** The panel presentations relating to the water/wastewater industry will provide information on industry jobs in engineering and the trades, job-hunting tips, and job-hunting help available on an ongoing basis from the BAYWORK website at baywork.org.
- **College Pathways:** For those interested in exploring vocational and engineering training options, a panel of educators from San Francisco Community College, Laney College, and Los Medanos College, will discuss training options available in the Bay Area.
- **Veterans Wanted:** A third set of panelists will discuss services available for veterans and tips for translating military service experience into terms that are meaningful to potential employers.

“This event allows ACWD to promote great career opportunities available in the water industry,” said ACWD General Manager Robert Shaver. “We rely on highly skilled, trained, technical staff to operate our water utility and the BAYWORK career fair is an excellent network to recruit industry professionals,” added Shaver.
