## Learning About Your Water Supply

The rainy season has officially begun and we couldn't be happier! You may have noticed water flowing in Alameda Creek, with some being routed into Quarry Lakes Regional Park in Fremont. While the park is operated by the East Bay Regional Park District, ACWD uses the lakes for recharging the aquifers of the Niles Cone Groundwater Basin, an immense, natural reservoir underlying the Tri-City area. We are able to collect water in Alameda Creek Flood Control Channel behind inflatable rubber dams, then divert this water into Quarry Lakes allowing for the water to percolate into the groundwater basin. Eventually, this water becomes drinking water that supplies close to half of the water used in Fremont, Newark and Union City.
