Subject: Notification of Main Renewal – Souza Avenue and Concord Street Project
Community Virtual Informational Meeting, Job 21191

The Alameda County Water District (ACWD) will soon begin construction of the Main Renewal – Souza Avenue and Concord Street Project in the city of Newark. This project is part of the District's Main Renewal and Seismic Upgrade Program, and the Small Diameter Renewal Program. These programs represent our continued investment to upgrade essential infrastructure and improve water supply reliability. The project is supported by customer rate dollars.

The Project includes the installation of approximately 1 mile of new pipe and replacement of all water service laterals, valves, and fire hydrants on Burdick Street, Souza Avenue, Ruschin Drive, Hafner Street, Concord Street, Concord Place and Toulon Place with interconnections to other pipelines on Musick Avenue, Bishop Way, Ruschin Drive, Munyan Street, Fair Avenue, Montcalm Avenue, and Fontaine Avenue in the city of Newark.

ACWD's contractor, Teichert Construction (Contractor), will start work in late July 2020 and is expected to complete the work in January 2021. Most work will take place Monday through Friday, 8 a.m. through 4:30 p.m., although some after-hours, weekend, and night work may occur.

The project team will implement several measures to minimize impacts to the surrounding community knowing that large construction projects can be disruptive. These include careful planning for traffic controls in coordination with the City of Newark, and special design and construction methods to minimize water service outages for our customers. However, during construction, temporary noise, dust, parking restrictions, and traffic controls are expected.

During the pipeline installation process, water mains will be temporarily out of service and will result in service interruptions that range in duration of one to eight hours. While we recognize these outages may cause inconveniences, they are necessary for the completion of the project. Note, not all residents will experience service interruptions. Should your residence be scheduled for a planned outage, you will be provided 24 hours advance notification.

As essential infrastructure work supporting essential governmental functions, this project will move forward in compliance with all applicable public health orders and will include additional

measures as necessary to protect the public, ACWD's employees, contractors, and other agency personnel associated with the work.


